Fourteen athletes feature in the Top 50 rankings for athletes for 2010 which is a sign of the healthy nature of athletics in Guernsey.

The results are a summary of the top UK performances and some of the clubs top athletes feature prominently. Lee Merrien's excellent season is reflected in his top 50 performances in six events – 3,00m, 5,000 and 10,000 m on the track and 10 miles, half marathon and marathon on the road. Lee's marathon ranking was the highest placed Guernsey performance when his London Marathon time placed him 7th and, even more impressively, his performance in the European championships was ranked 2nd best marathon as European events are given greater weighting. Louise Perrio 's improvements are also demonstrated in her appearance in the top 50 for the 3000m steeplechase, 5000m and 10 mile road race. Various club stalwarts are also included in the rankings. Lee Garland, Martine Scholes, Glenn Etherington and Tom Druce all record a ranked position. Dale Garland had top 20 places for the 400m and 400m hurdles and Kylie Robilliard's excellent 110m hurdles in Delhi gained her 15th position.

But pride of place goes to a crop of youngsters who are beginning to fulfil the potential that they have shown over the years.

Ross Hanley's record Triple jump of 13 m 57 placed him 16th in the under 17 rankings whilst Leo Rice managed the top ten with his record breaking 400m hurdles in June. Charlton Avery placed 15th in the high jump for under 15 boys just one place behind James Brehaut's excellent javelin throw which placed him 14th overall.

Katie Rowe had an excellent season as was demonstrated by her 11th place in the girls under 13 1500m rankings. The highest ranking junior position goes to youngster Cameron Hantonne whose long jump of 5 meters 4centimeters in the Inter insular in September placed him 8th in the under 13 rankings
